Loh will bring his expertise in conducting


live films in concert to the Waco Hall stage

Waco Symphony Council



Reserve Bus Tickets

Don't want to drive at night or search for a parking spot? Reserve your seat on the bus when ordering your concert tickets. All Waco Transit vehicles are ADA accessible and are equipped with a wheelchair lift or ramp. A season bus pass allows you to ride the bus to all four season concerts for \$40 (does not include *Nutcracker* or *Jurassic Park in Concert* performances). Bus tickets are \$12 per ticket for individual concerts including the Saturday night *Nutcracker* performance and *Jurassic Park* in Concert. Classical concert and Nutcracker buses will depart at 6:10 p.m. from Gold's Gym parking lot on Waco Drive next to El Conquistador restaurant and will arrive in time for Opening Notes talks. *Jurassic Park* in Concert bus departs at 5:45 p.m. We will only offer one bus per evening.
